



Want to know more about the GDPR? Data Protection Officer Training

In 2018 General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) came into effect with new, enforceable regulations for the handling and storing of data, to create a safer data environment. This means organisations will be looking to Data Protection Officers (DPO) to oversee their data protection.

The Universities of Derby and Loughborough are offering free DPO training places addressing the changes in the data protection regulations and how this impacts on developing, overseeing, and implementing data protection policy.

The DPO course is relevant for those looking to play an active role in data management and the implementation of data protection policies in ensuring their organisation is compliant with the new standards. It will also be useful for students or others wishing to learn more about the implications of the new data protection regulations.

Sessions will focus on:



Legal Module, with a focus on providing knowledge about the legal framework for data protection



Technical, organizational and Impact Assessment Module, targeting technical aspects of data creation, management, storing, as well as the ability to devise data management strategies and evaluate the impact of policies



Behavioural and Security Module, aimed at allowing participants to understand the impact of data in the behaviour of a given organization, and to acquire the ability to manage the security-related aspects involved
